Brief description:

The GAD-7 is an anxiety scale that can be used for assessing anxiety severity in clinical practices and in research. Items are scored using a 4-point scale (0-3).

Notes:

- Scores ≥10: Further assessment (including diagnostic interview and mental status examination) and/or referral to a mental health professional recommended
- Scores 5-9: mild, monitor
- 10*-14: moderate, possible clinically significant condition
- >15: severe, active treatment probably warranted
- *For Panic Disorder, Social Phobia, & PTSD, cut-off score of 8 may be used for optimal sensitivity/specificity
- This scoring manual is intended to be used only with the questionnaire version on braincode.ca
